SAUVAGNARGUES SUPPORTS ARAB LEAGUE, PRAISES ARAFAT

Oct. 24 (IPS)--Meeting in Lebanon, French Foreign Minister Jean Sauvagnargues and Rockefeller agent Yasser Arafat went through maneuvers for the Trilateral Commission to consolidate a European Economic Community-Middle East bloc "independent from United States control."

IPS is monitoring the development of the Europe-Arab alliance, which is geared to provide a radical cover for the relocation of industry and workers into the Mediterranean-Mideast area and to tactically disarm Soviet bloc, European Communist Party, and social democratic forces into support of CIA-controlled Arab states like Iran and Algeria.

Before meeting Arafat, Sauvagnargues talked in Jordan of a revitalized Gaullism, praising French support since De Gaulle's days for Arab politics. From Lebanon, Sauvagnargues then proclaimed that France would support whatever decision the Arab leaders make at their upcoming conference. Following the meeting with Arafat, Sauvagnargues declared the need to "develop closer links between the EEC and the Arab League." Then Sauvagnargues declared Arafat to be a "realistic and moderate man with the stature of a statesman."

The official Israeli reaction to the Sauvagnargues-Arafat meeting was to call it "another Munich," interpretable either as vintage 1938 or 1972 (the Olympic Games massacre).
