I. INTERNATIONAL PRESS WRAP-UP.

PERU PROTESTS U.S. EFFORTS TO SABOTAGE DEVELOPMENT AT U.N.

SEPT. 15 (IPS)--IN AN EDITORIAL SEPT. 11, THE NEWSPAPER PUBLISHED BY THE OFFICE OF THE PRESIDENT OF PERU DESCRIBED THE "DESPERATE MANUEVERS" OF U.S. SECRETARY OF STATE KISSINGNER AND U.S. AMBASS-ADOR TO THE UNITED NATIONS, DANIEL MOYNIHAN TO PREVENT THE PRO-GRAM ENDORSED AT THE LIMA CONFERENCE OF NON-ALIGNED NATIONS FROM BEING ADOPTED AT THE UNITED NATIONS SPECIAL SESSION.

ENTITLED "OFFENSIVE AGAINST THE THIRD WORLD," THE EDITORIAL IN LA CRONICA STATED, "THE SURPRISING NORTH AMERICAN POSITION HAS BEEN UNANIMOUSLY DESCRIBED AS AN OVERT DELAYING AND PRESSURE MANUEVER TO GAIN TIME SO AS TO PREVENT ANY AGREEMENTS ON THESE VITAL POINTS FROM BEING REACHED BY THE CLOSING OF THE SPECIAL SESSION TOMORROW, FRIDAY, AND THUS ELUDE THE RESULTING COMMITMENT TO THE WORLD. TWO LINES AND TWO TACTICS HAVE NOW BEEN DEFINED MORE CLEARLY THAN EVER INSIDE THE UNITED NATIONS. ONE ONE SIDE ARE THE NATIONS WHICH IN-CLUDE TWO-THIRDS OF HUMANITY, AND ON THE OTHER THE IMPERIALIST AND HEGEMONIC MINORITY WHICH TRIES TO MAINTAIN ITS PREDOMINANCE AT ALL COSTS."

LONDON SUNDAY TIMES NOTES SPLIT IN U.N. TALKS

SEPT. 15 (IPS)--THE LONDON SUNDAY TIMES NOTED THE FRANTIC EFFORTS OF THE EUROPEANS TO REACH A COMPROMISE AGREEMENT WITH THE "GROUP OF 77" DEVELOPING NATIONS AT THE ON-GOING U.N. SPECIAL SESSION DE-SPITE U.S. OPPOSITION. REPORTING WITH OBVIOUS RELIEF AN OFFER EROW THE EUROPEANS TO DOUBLE AND TO THE THIRD WORLD. THE SUNDAY

NEW PORTUGUESE GOVERNMENT PROGRAM: SOMETHING FOR EVERYONE

SEPT. 15 (IPS) -- THE RECENTLY ANNOUNCED PROGRAM OF PORTUGAL'S SIXTH PROVISIONAL GOVERNMENT IS SUPPORTED BY ALL POLITICAL PERSUASIONS, ACCORDING TO VARIOUS PRESS REPORTS.

EAST GERMAN RADIO CALLED THE PROGRAM A REPLICA OF THE DEMANDS OF THE PORTUGUESE COMMUNIST PARTY YESTERDAY, SPECIFICALLY CITING THE IMPLEMENTATION OF SOME OF THE REVOLUTIONARY ACHIEVEMENTS OF THE GONCALVES GOVERNMENT, LIKE AGRARIAN REFORM.

MARIO SOARES, AGENT HEAD OF THE PORTUGUESE SOCIALIST PARTY, WAS ALSO PRAISWORTHY OF THE PROGRAM, ACCORDING TO UNITED PRESS INTER-NATIONAL, IN THAT "HE BELIEVED THAT THE PROGRAM WOULD FULFILL THE . CONDITIONS FOR POLITICAL PLURALISM."

NEVERTHELESS, THE PORTUGUESE DAILY O SECULO COMMENTED, "THE SIXTH PROVISIONAL GOVERNMENT WILL NOT LAST LONG," ACCORDING TO A UPI-REPORT.

FIRST NATIONAL CITY BANK IS WORRIED THAT "INFLATION WILL SLOW THE RECOVERY LARGELY THROUGH ITS ADVERSE IMPACT ON CONSUMER SPENDING."

AS THE SHORT-LIVED IMPACT OF TAX REBATES EXPIRED IN AUGUST AND RETAIL SALES PLUMMETED 0.8 PERCENT, DONALD WOOLLEY, ECONOMIST FOR BANKERS TRUST, DISCOVERS THAT "INVENTORY LIQUIDATION IS OVER AND THERE IS NO EVIDENCE THAT THERE WILL BE A REBUILDING OF STOCKS."

REPORTING THESE REALITIES TODAY, THE JOURNAL OF COMMERCE HINTS THAT THE ONLY HOPE IS THE LESSENING OF LABOR UNION DEMANDS FOR WAGE INCREASES DURING THE UPCOMING CONTRACT NEGOTIATIONS.

NEW TREASURY NOTES TO SUCK FUNDS FROM BANKS

SEPT. 15 (IPS)--THE WALL STREET JOURNAL TODAY PREDICTS THAT TOMORROW'S SALE OF \$3 BILLION IN TWO-YEAR TREASURY NOTES COULD "...DRAIN SUB-STANTIAL FUNDS FROM SAVINGS BANKS" AND THUS DRY UP THE PRINCIPAL SOURCE OF MONEY FOR HOME MORTGAGES. INTEREST RETURNS ON THESE TREASURY NOTES IS EXPECTED TO RISE TO 8.5 PERCENT, SUBSTANTIALLY ABOVE THE 5.2 PERCENT AND 7.2 PERCENT RATES OFFERED ON MOST SAVINGS ACCOUNT DEPOSITS.

ACCORDING TO ONE GOVERNMENT DEALER "THE SWISHING NOISE YOU HEAR ON TUESDAY WILL BE THE SOUND OF MONEY BEING SUCKED OUT OF THE BANKS BY THOSE NEW NOTES."

BRAZIL MODEL FOR FREE MARKET DEVELOPMENT?

SEPT. 15 (IPS)--BRAZIL'S "RELIANCE ON FREE MEARKETS DESERVES CLOSER ATTENTION FROM OTHER UNDEVELOPED LANDS LOOKING TO ESCAPE THE ECON-OMIC MIRE, "WITES THE WALL STREET JOURNAL IN AN EDITORIAL TODAY.

ATTACKING THE POSITION OF THIRD WORLD GOVERNMENTS ON DEVELOPMENT OUESTIONS, THE JOURNAL SAYS "THE REAL DIFFERENCE BETWEEN (THE NON-ALIGNED NATIONS) AND BRAZIL IS THAT BRAZIL HAS OPTED TO TIE ITS ECONOMIC FUTURE TO THE MARKET ECONOMY INSTEAD OF PURSUING THE GRAIL OF STATE SOCIALISM."

FOUR-FIFTHS O BAZIL'S ECONOMY IS CONTROLLED YTHE BRAZILIAN GOVERNMENT. NONETHELESS, IN TESTIMONY TO THE ACCURACY OF THE JOUR-NAL'S EDITORS, THESE STATE AGENCIES HAVE APPLIED TO THE "FREE MARKET" IN INTERNATIONAL EURODOLLAR LOANS FOR ROUGHLY \$20 BILLION DURING THE PAST DECADE. BANKERS SAY THEY PREFER LENDING TO BRAZIL RATHER THAN TO INDUSTRY AT HOME, FOR EXAMPLE, SINCE THEIR RATE OF RETURN ON THESE LOANS IS ABOUT TWICE AS HIGH.
