MICHEL DEBRE HITS ATLANTICIST GOVERNMENT ON SUPRANATIONALITY, INFLATION

FEB. 20 (IPS)--IN A MAJOR ATTACK ON THE GISCARD D'ESTAING GOVERN-MENT PUBLISHED IN THE FEB. 13 LE MONDE, GAULLIST LEADER MICHEL DEBRE ASSAILED THE GOVERNMENT'S "SUPRANATIONAL" FOREIGN POLICY AND INCOMPETENT DOMESTIC ECONOMIC POLICY. DEBRE'S ATTACK ON FOR-EIGN POLICY FOCUSED ON THE GOVERNMENT'S AGREEMENT WITH THE ATLAN-TICIST TINDEMANS PLAN FOR AN INTEGRATED EUROPE, QUESTIONING THE LEGALITY OF SUCH A PLAN UNDER THE PRESENT FRENCH CONSTITUTION AND WARNING THAT SUCH PROPOSALS TIREATENED THE VERY EXISTENCE OF FRANCE AS A NATION-STATE. ON THE DOMESTIC ECONOMY. DEBRE SCATH-INGLY ATTACKED THE ECONOMIC POLICIES PUSHED OVER THE PAST FIVE YEARS BY BOTH GOVERNMENT AND SOCIALIST PARTY "EXPERTS" WHICH HAVE LED TO A DEVASTATING INFLATIONARY SPIRAL AND MASSIVE CUTBACKS IN DOMESTIC CONSUMPTION.

PARALLELING THIS POLITICAL ATTACK IN THE FRENCH BOURGEOIS PRESS, DEBRE TWO DAYS AGO GAVE AN INTERVIEW TO IL FIORINO, THE ITALIAN BUSINESS NEWSPAPER CLOSELY ASSOCIATED WITH THE FACTION OF PRO-DEVELOPMENT INDUSTRIALIST EUGENIO CEFIS.

<u>NEW ZIMBABWE LIBERATION MOVEMENT</u> FORMING WITH SOVIET BACKING

WIESBADEN, W. GERMANY, FEB. 20 (IPS) — A NEW ZIMBABWE (RHODESIA) LIBERATION MOVEMENT IS BEING FORMED FROM ALL PREVIOUS FACTIONS WITH FULL SOVIET SUPPORT, ACCORDING TO AN AFRICAN DIPLOMATIC SOURCE IN EUROPE.

THE SOURCE SAID THAT EARLIER LEADERS OF ALL THESE FACTIONS HAVE BEEN IDENTIFIED AS AGENTS OF FOREIGN INTELLIGENCE SERVICES. "NOTABLY THE CIA," AND ARE BEING DUMPED. TERMING JOSHUA NKOMO, HEAD OF THE "INTERNAL" AFRICAN NATIONAL COUNCIL AND FORMER HEAD OF THE ZIMBABWE AFRICAN PEOPLE'S UNION, A MERE "WATCHDOG OVER LA-BOR" WHO HAS BEEN DISCREDITED, THE SOURCE SAID THAT REV. NDABAN-INGI SITHOLE, CURRENT HEAD OF THE EXTERNAL AFRICAN NATIONS COUN-CIL AND FORMER HEAD OF THE MAOIST ZIMBABWE AFRICAN NATIONAL UNION, AND REV. ABEL MUZOREWA, FORMER HEAD OF THE ORIGINAL AFRI-CAN NATIONAL COUNCIL AND RECENT ALLY OF SITHOLE'S, HAVE BEEN KICKED OUT OF THE GUERILLA CAMPS IN MOZAMBIQUE AND TANZANIA AND

TOLD NOT TO COME BACK. JAMES CHIKEREMA, FORMER HEAD OF THE SPLINTER FRONT FOR THE LIBERATION OF ZIMBADWE, HAS RECENTLY BEEN PLACED UNDER ARREST BY THE GOVERNMENT OF MOZAMBIQUE, ACCORDING TO THE SOURCE.

OGDEN REMAINS IN JAIL AS LABOR PARTY BEGINS PRESSURE ON CONGRESS TO FORCE RELEASE

RICHMOND, VA., FEB. 20 (IPS)--U.S. LABOR PARTY SENATORIAL CANDI-DATE ALAN OGDEN REMAINS INCARCERATED HERE, EIGHT DAYS AFTER HE WAS RAILROADED INTO A 30-DAY JAIL SEATENCE ON CHARGES OF TRES-PASSING AT A PUBLIC MEETING AND RESISTING ARREST. HE IS BEING HELD ON 2,000 DOLLARS BAIL, OF WHICH 1,000 DOLLARS IT HAS BEEN STIPULATED MUST BE IN CASH.

A LABOR PARTY SPOKESMAN IN WASHINGTON, D.C. SAID LAST NIGHT THE PARTY WILL PUT PRESSURE ON CONGRESS TO FREE OGDEN. "THE OG-DEN CASE CLEARLY DEMONSTRATES A BLATANT CONSPIRACY ON THE PART OF LAW ENFORCEMENT AND JUDICIAL AUTHORITIES TO VIOLATE THE CIVIL LIBERTIES OF LABOR PARTY MEMBERS," THE PARTY SPOKESMAN SAID. "THESE ACTIONS MUST BE UNDERSTOOD IN THE CONTEXT OF THE ANNOUNCED INTENTION OF ATTORNEY GENERAL EDWARD LEVI, CHIEF JUSTICE WARREN BURGER AND OTHERS TO ESTABLISH A POLICE STATE IN THIS COUNTRY."

"IMMEDIATELY TARGETTED WILL BE MEMBERS OF THE VIRGINIA CON-GRESSIONAL DELEGATION AND THE MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE AND SENATE JU-DICIARY COMMITTEES. WE ARE DEMANDING THAT THEY TAKE ACTION TO PROTECT THE CONSTITUTION AND FREE OGDEN," THE SPOKESMAN SAID. "THEY WILL LEARN THAT THEIR CONSTITUENCIES AND WORKERS AROUND THE COUNTRY WILL NOT TOLERATE THEIR INACTION."

LABOR PARTY FILES FOR EXEMPTION FROM ELECTION-LAW DISCLOSURE REQUIREMENTS

WASHINGTON, D.C., FEB. 20 (IPS) THE COMMITTEE TO ELECT LAROUCHE-EVANS AND THE U.S. LABOR PARTY YESTERDAY APPLIED FOR EXEMPTION FROM THE DISCLOSURE REQUIREMENTS OF THE FEDERAL ELECTION LAW. THE LABOR PARTY HAS ASKED THE FEDERAL ELECTION COMMISSION FOR A HEARING AT WHICH THE LABOR PARTY WILL PRESENT MASSIVE EVIDENCE OF HARASSMENT DIRECTED AT LABOR PARTY MEMBERS AND SUPPORTERS.

UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE RECENT SUPREME COURT RULING WHICH GAVE CONGRESS UNTIL THE END OF FEDRUARY TO RECONSTITUTE THE FEC. "MINOR PARTIES" CAN APPLY FOR EXEMPTION FROM THE REQUIREMENTS FOR DISCLOSURE OF CONTRIBUTORS' NAMES BY SHOWING A REASONABLE PROOF THAT DISCLOSURE WILL SUBJECT CONTRIBUTORS TO "THREATS, HARASSMENT OR REPRISALS FROM EITHER GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS OR PRIVATE PARTIES." THE LABOR PARTY WILL DEMONSTRATE TO THE FEC THAT A MASSIVE NATION-AL CONSPIRACY EXISTS, COORDINATED BY ATTORNEY GENERAL EDWARD LEVI AND THE JUSTICE DEPARTMENT, WHOSE PUPPOSE 15 TO ATTEMPT TO CONTAIN AND STOP THE EXPLOSIVE GROWTH OF THE USLP'S INFLUENCE.

ACCORDING TO FEC STAFF OFFICIALS, THE REQUEST SUBMITTED YES-TERDAY BY THE LABOR PARTY WILL BE SUFFICIENT TO INITIATE A HEAR-ING TO DETERMINE EXEMPTION. FEC OFFICIALS INDICATED THAT THE LA-BOR PARTY IS THE ONLY PARTY SEEKING SUCH AN EXEMPTION TO DATE. EARLY IPS 02.20.1530/PAGE THREE

ISRAELI LABOR LEADER WARNS OF "VERY SERIOUS RIDTS" IN RESPONSE TO AUSTERITY MEASURES

FEB. 20 (IPS)-YEHOSHUA MESHEL, SECRETARY-GENERAL OF THE NATIONAL ISRAELI TRADE UNION CONFEDERATION, THE HISTADRUT, WARNED LAST WEEKEND THAT ISRAEL WILL FACE SERIOUS UNREST AND "VERY SERIOUS RIOTS" IF THE GOVERNMENT AUSTERITY BUDGET PROPOSALS GO INTO EF-FECT APRIL 1, THE FEB. 15 JERUSALEM POST REPORTS.

CITING THE RECENT PRICE INCREASES OF UP TO 50 PER CENT FOR SUCH BASIC COMMODITIES AS BREAD AND MILK. MESHEL DEMANDED THAT ALLOCATIONS FOR SOCIAL SERVICES AND SUBSIDIES FOR BASIC COMMODI-TIES BE INCREASED TO AVERT DISASTROUS SOCIAL UNREST.

AT THE SAME TIME, THE POST REPORTS, ADVOCATES OF SCHACHTIAN ECONOMICS IN ISRAEL ARE DEMANDING NEW LEVELS OF AUSTERITY FOR IS-RAEL'S POPULATION. FINANCE MINISTER RABINOWITZ CALLED FOR AN IM-MEDIATE REDUCTION OF THE STANDARD OF LIVING, SINCE "THERE ARE NO MORE MIRACLES." AND BANK OF ISRAEL GOVERNOR DAVID HOROWITZ, WARNING THAT ISRAEL'S ECONOMY IS CRUMBLING, CALLED FOR THE GOV-ERNMENT TO BE GIVEN SPECIAL EMERGENCY POWERS FOR THE NEXT TWO YEARS, IN ORDER TO APPLY SIMILAR AUSTERITY MEASURES TO THOSE BE-ING RAMMED THROUGH IN BRITAIN BY "GOOD SOCIALIST" PRIME MINISTER HAROLD WILSON.

U.S. THREATENS INDONESIA WITH FOOD AID CUT-OFF

WASHINGTON, D.C., FEB. 20 (IPS) - THE UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT HAS THREATENED TO CUT OFF FREE FOOD SHIPMENTS TO INDONESIA ON THE GROUNDS THAT PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENTS HAVE FAILED TO ASSIST RELIEF AGENCIES IN ITS DISTRIBUTION.

ACCORDING TO JAPANESE PRESS SOURCES, THE THREAT WAS CONTAINED IN A REPORT ISSUED BY THE U.S. OFFICE OF THE INSPECTOR GENERAL OF FOREIGN SERVICES LAST MONTH. A U.S. STATE DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN SAID YESTERDAY THAT "WE ARE IN COMPLETE AGREEMENT WITH THE IN-SPECTOR GENERAL'S REPORT." HOWEVER, THE SPOKESMAN ADDED, THE U.S. WILL NOT SUSPEND THE FOOD SHIPMENTS UNTIL IT SPEAKS WITH THE INDONESIAN AUTHORITIES. AND CONGRESSMAN LES ASPIN OF WISCOMSIN HAS CALLED FOR THE IMMEDIATE SUSPENSION OF THE 3 MILLION DOLLAR AID PROGRAM ON THE GROUNDS OF INDONESIAN CORRUPTION.

THE PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENTS ARE STAFFED BY MILITARY AND FORMER MILITARY OFFICERS WHO REPRESENT THE POLITICAL BASE OF SUPPORT FOR THE PRO-DEVELOPMENT FACTION IN THE INDONESIAN GOVERNMENT.

UDR MEMBER DENIES SPLIT IN GAULLISTS, SAYS NO GAULLIST ALLIANCE WITH PCF

FEB. 20 (IPS) -- IN A RADIO INTERVIEW ON FRANCE INTER FEB. 17, CLAUDE LABBE, A PARLIAMENTARY LEADER OF FRANCE'S GAULLIST UDR PARTY, DENIED THAT THERE WAS ANY SPLIT BETWEEN THE "HISTORIC GAULLISTS" CLOSELY ASSOCIATED WITH THE UDR BARONS AND THE ATLAN-TICIST "GAULLISTS OF TODAY" WHO HAVE KEPT THE UDR PARTY AFFILI-ATED WITH THE GISCARD D'ESTAING GOVERNMENT. LABBE, A CLOSE ASSO-CIATE OF PRIME MINISTER JACQUES CHIRAC, RECENTLY RETURNED FROM DISCUSSIONS WITH LEADING MEMBERS OF THE CHRISTIAN DEMOCRATIC UNION IN WEST GERMANY.

LABBE ALSO DENIED ANY POSSIBILITY OF A WORKING ALLIANCE BE-TWEEN THE GAULLISTS AND THE FRENCH COMMUNIST PARTY, STATING THAT THE HISTORICAL PRECEDENT FOR THIS ACTION IN 1954 WAS SIMPLY AN "HISTORICAL PHENOMENON." "AT THE PRESENT MOMENT," HE SAID, "EV-ERYTHING DIVIDES US."

PCF HINTS DESIRE FOR PARTICIPATION IN GISCARD GOVERNMENT

FEB. 20 (IPS)--THE FRENCH COMMUNIST PARTY (PCF) TODAY RENEWED ITS OVERTURES TO THE ATLANTICIST GISCARD D'ESTAING GOVERNMENT FOR A FRENCH-STYLE "HISTORICAL COMPROMISE," UNDER WHICH PRESIDENT GIS-CARD WOULD APPOINT A CABINET INCLUDING COMMUNIST MINISTERS. EDI-TORIALIST LAURENT SALINI TODAY PEEVISHLY ATTACKED A SCHEDULED PUBLIC DEBATE BETWEEN FINANCE MINISTER FOURCADE AND SOCIALIST PARTY LEADER AND NOMINAL ALLY OF THE PCF, FRANCOIS MITTERRAND, ON THE GROUNDS THAT, ACCORDING TO THE RULES OF "FRENCH PLURALISM," THE SOCIALIST PARTY IS NOT AN ACCEPTABLE SPOKESMAN FOR THE FRENCH WORKING CLASS. FEB. 20 (IPS) - DENIS HEALEY, THE BRITISH CHANCELLOR OF THE EXCHE-QUER, ANNOUNCED YESTERDAY A 9.6 BILLION DOLLAR SLASH IN PUBLIC SERVICES OVER THE NEXT THREE YEARS.
