Grid of NATO-NSC Terror Activation

May 14 (IPS) — The following is a grid of NATO-National Security Council (NSC) terrorist deployments and related developments beginning May 9:

May 9 — Ulrike Meinhof, of the NATO-controlled Baader-Meinhof terrorist gang, was found hanging in her Stuttgart prison cell.

May 10-11 — Bombings and violent demonstrations "to protest Meinhof's death" erupt against West German offices in Rome, Paris, Nimes and Stockholm, Sweden. Maoists riot in Frankfurt; five police hospitalized.

May 11 — Bolivian Ambassador to France gunned down outside his Paris office. "International Brigade of Che Guevara" claims credit for assassination. French Interior Ministry heighten domestic "security" measures.

May 11 — European Labor Party office in Stuttgart receives bomb threat.

May 12 — Seven U.S. Labor Party candidates in Ohio receive death threats in the mail (see article in this issue.)

May 12 — Maine Power and Light Co. in Augusta, Me. bombed by "Fred Hampton Brigade."

May 13 — NATO-controlled terrorist "Carlos" reported to be in Canada. Canadian police authorities issue warning of possible "terror wave."

May 13 — West German government reports 27 active members of Baader-Meinhof gang at large, backed by 4,059 sympathizers, armed with bazookas and machine guns.

May 13 — Baader-Meinhof terrorists threaten to bomb trains leaving France for West Germany. French authorities restrict train traffic to West Germany to inspect trains.

May 14 — Head of the Credit Lyonnais, second largest Franch bank, assassinated in Paris by anarchist-terrorist who kills self.

May 14 — Barcelona, Spain offices of West German chemical firm blown up.

May 14 — Ordine Nuova, gang of NATO-controlled fascist blackshirts, announces new terror offensive in Italy.

May 14 — Largest shopping center in Munich, West Germany is bombed.

May 14 — Milan offices of Bosch, West German manufacturing firm, are bombed.
